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What is dual enrollment?

- A program that allows high school students to enroll in college courses for credit prior to high school graduation
- Successful completion of the college course will allow student to earn both high school credits and college credits
- College courses can be taken on a college campus, online, or at a high school (can also be referred to as concurrent enrollment)
- Dual Enrollment courses are typically equivalent to semester long courses

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How might dual enrollment benefit and support my child?

- College general education courses or electives completed while in high school could allow for a more flexible college schedule
- Experience college level courses within a high school setting
- Cost Saving
 - Dual enrollment course credits typically are much less than college credits after HS graduation
 - Graduate from college early
 - Allow for time to double major

College course credits/Great Valley credits

- Earn GV credits and Immaculata college credits

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Costs

- The cost for each course is \$100 per credit, payable directly to Immaculata University.
 - 3 credit courses - \$300
 - 6 credit courses - \$600
- You might be required to pay a transfer fee for a university or college your child is considering.
- Please contact [Dr. Capetola](#) or [Dr. O'Toole](#) if you have a financial hardship assistance may be available to you.

What are other considerations regarding dual enrollment?

- Some courses may not transfer to every college – just as some AP courses are not accepted at every college
- Some courses will not replace core major or general education courses, but may transfer as electives
- Some college majors may not allow core major classes to be replaced by dual enrollment. Such is true for Advanced Placement (i.e. Biology for Pre-med Programs)
- Typically, only dual enrollment courses with a grade of "C" or higher will transfer

What are other considerations regarding dual enrollment?

- Your child's Great Valley teacher is the teacher of record for the Immaculata course.
- Your child will complete the work assigned by the Great Valley teacher. There is no additional outside work or additional tests that are required by Immaculata.
- Your child's Great Valley teacher will send the final course grade to Immaculata at the end of the year.
- The Great Valley final grade is the Immaculata grade and will appear on an Immaculata transcript.
- When your child applies to a college, the institution would only know about dual enrollment if you notify them and/or submit a transcript for transfer credit.
- You do not need to request a transcript from Immaculata and send it to another college. If your child earns Immaculata credit, your child will have a transcript/college record at Immaculata; however, you are not obligated to share the transcript with another institution unless you want to request transfer credits. If your child attends Immaculata, the credits will appear on his/her Immaculata transcript.

Online Course Transfer Check

College Transfer Tool – Course Equivalencies

Due to the specific college requirements and eligibility for transfer credit, we cannot guarantee that the credits will transfer. However, if you are interested in seeing if your credits will transfer to a specific institution, use College Transfer <https://www.collegetransfer.net/> and enter the Immaculata course code to view eligible transfer courses.
